NOTEWORTHY THINGS OF THE YEAR

Celebration of 150th birth anniversary year of Swami Vivekannda

2013 being the 150th birth anniversary year of Swami Vivekannda, Wardhinee decided to spread Swamijee's inspiring messages in the society. In this respect Wardhinee Shakha students & volunteers (Total number 650)visited near about 24,700 homes in different parts of Pune City and villages around Pune. Swamiji's photo with a message on it was given as gift to every household. During this campaign, the students /volunteers also had an opportunity to talk about the activities run by Wardhinee.



A step towards expansion of the ongoing projects

Since last 2 years, efforts are being made to find out like minded people and organizations outside Pune City. Now in districts like Satara, Solapur & Nasik, we have come across with some volunteers as well as some local reputed organizations/ institutes who have shown interest in Wardhinee activities. As a step in this direction a two day residential camp was organized at Solapur. 15 students from Thobade Slum area were selected for the camp. It was their first experience and even the parents were also not very confident that their children would stay in an unknown atmosphere. However, during the concluding session the children as well as their parents expressed their happiness. Children liked the sessions, the new games, the inspiring songs and overall atmosphere of the camp. After listening to the experiences

shared by the children, the parents realized that their children need such type of activity. They expected that Wardhinee should start a branch at Solapur as soon as possible. Efforts are being made to start a centre at Solapur. Shri. Santosh Gaikwad, a local businessman, has shown eagerness to shoulder the responsibility of Solapur branch of Wardhinee.

Kargil Victory Celebration

The Nation celebrates 26th July as the Victory day. On this day india won the war against Pakisthan, which is also known as Kargil War. This celebration reminds the youth about their inner strength and the necessity of being alert. Brig. Shri. Hemant Mahajan was the Chief Guest along with Shri.S.N.Deshpande of Bhartiya Majdoor Sangh. Shri. Mahajan through his power point presentation explained the audience about China's aggression and how it creates disturbance through intrusion activities at the border, time and again. He appealed the youth to join the Forces.

Paddy 'field experience'

The youth like to enjoy the treks in heavy rain season, whereas farmers in villages are facing shortage of manpower in the specific period of re-plantation of paddy. Adv.Nandu Phadke; a well known lawyer and social worker in Pune has started a program of building a pool between Pune City and Winzer Village. 200 youths and students of Wardhinee visited Winzer

village, about 60 Km from Pune. They worked in the paddy fieldthroughout the day and helped the local farmers to replant the rice plants. The youths and the students experienced the



laborious work the whole family of the farmer is required to do. They experienced the body pains; especially the back ache while working the whole day. It made them realize that we should not waste food. The farmers on the other hand thanked the students and the volunteer team for their timely help.



Rakhi- a bonding to follow the Rules

The central office team of 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee decided to celebrate the Rakhipournima in a novel way. They contacted the Traffic Police Dept, sought their permission and jointly with them executed the idea. They all stood in a chowk, where one of the road was meant for one way travelling. Those who came by that road, on their vehicle, breaking the traffic rule, were stopped. A rakhi was tied on their wrist and promise was taken from them that henceforth they will strictly follow the traffic rules. The media gave a good coverage to this novel concept.

Abhyas Yagnya-

God Shri. Ganeshe being the God of Buddhi (Intelligence), the students of the self study centre, especially those appearing for the competitive examinations like MPSC, decided to celebrate the 10 days of Ganeshotsav by doing maximum study. Every student set his target of minimum 12 hours a day. Total number of 100 students participated in this novel program. The whole period of Ganeshotsav became a Abhyas Yagnya for the Self Study Centre. Daily the daily yagnya started with a Ganesh Vandana and concluded with the Ganesh Aarti.



Inauguration of Spardha Pariksha Scholarship Batch

The 3rd scholarship batch of Spardha Pariksha Kendra was inaugurated at the hands of Pimpri Chinchwad Municipal Corporation Commissioner Dr. Shrikar Pardeshi on 12th October, 2013 While addressing the students, Dr.Pardeshi told that he looks at the job as a paid social service. He said you are paid to serve the society and if you serve honestly & sincerely the society is benefitted to a great extent. If the Officer sitting in the responsible chair, decides, he can bring the necessary changes in the society by using his authority. He shared his experiences in the campaign successfully run by him to eradicate the 'mass copy' culture in the SSC/HSC Board Examinations. He also briefed the students his experiences in the campaign to check the actual number of students in the schools. Due to such campaigns and the shocking outcome, the State Government had to take stern action against the guilty and make necessary changes in the Govt. policies to stop the illegal practices in the field of education.

To celebrate the Kojagiri full moon night, the youth wing had invited the famous cine artist namely Shri.Girish Kulkarni. During his informal interview, he explained how he gets prepared for any character role in the films, the efforts any artist has to take to get involved with the character. Few students of the centre took initiative in telling motivational stories and some took lead in organizing games, picture drawing session etc. At the end of the program all the kids of the orphanage were given snacks.



The visit to this orphanage gave an insight to the would be Govt. Officers to know the real life of orphans, their problems and the necessity to encourage NGOs working in this field.

Letter to Mother-



Mother is the center point of every family. Though the feelings of gratitude are not expressed to her by the children, they have high regards for her devotion and contribution in their upbringing and her vital role behind the screen. With a view to celebrate the Mother's Day, the girl students were asked to write a letter to their mother. In the begining the girl students felt it funny to write a letter to the mother with whom they stay under the same roof. However, when they started writing the letter, everyone of them got involved in writing the feelings of gratitude. The letters were sent by post. When the mothers received them, it was a pleasant

surprise to them but they liked the idea and the thought behind this project.

Encouragement as well as Responsibility

The well wisher and donor from United States, namely Dr.Balwant Joshi is supporting Wardhinee for more than 18 years. Through the generous donations received from him, Wardhinee could start a scholarship scheme from the year 1996, to support needy students.

Last year a project proposal to boost the sports talent, was sent to him for his kind consideration. Dr. Balwant Joshi donated an amount of Rs.6.56 lacs towards the project proposal of Sports & Nutritional Diet. In addition to this, Dr. Balwant Joshi released an amount of Rs.6.87 lacs for adding it to the corpus fund of the ongoing Student Scholarship Scheme, initiated by him. We are really grateful to Dr.Joshi and his family members for the confidence shown and for their encouragement. Such encouragement boosts the volunteers to work with more zeal. At the

same time it reminds the responsibility.

Participation in Teachers' Interaction Program at Jammu.

In order to develop a good rapport with the citizens of Jammu-Kashmir State, the Jammu Kashmir Study Centre had organized a Teachers' Interaction Program at Jammu during the



Diwali vacation. 6 teachers from different schools in Pune participated in this. Two senior volunteers of Wardhinee, namely Miss. Manisha Pathak & Miss Lata Tilekar who work as teachers in different schools, were among the 6 member team of teachers.

After visiting some of the schools in Jammu & Udhampur and conducting the Teachers' Training Program for the teachers from J&K, their observations and feelings are as under-

- Though the syllabus books are excellent from teaching point of view, it fails to develop the National perspective.
- The pledge which is an important part of any school syllabus books in the country, and which helps to imbibe the National spirit in the minds of the students, is absent in the syllabus books of J&K
- The teaching methods adopted by the local teachers do not attract the students.
- The team was shocked when they saw that the science lab was not even opened for many days and when it was opened, they found that the lab was not equipped with minimum required apparatus.
- The teachers team from Pune arranged some practical sessions for the local teachers.
 They demonstrated how the skill development in reading, writing, communication helps to create interest in the language teaching, as well as funny experiments based on scientific concepts attracts the students to learn science with interest.
- They very strongly felt that experienced teachers from various parts of Bharat must develop a communication pool with the teachers in J&K. This will help to boost the real spirit of national integration.

Coaching Centre for Homi Bhabha Balvaigyanik Spardha Pariksha

Since last two years, Wardhinee is running this centre for the students of 6th & 9th Std. The competition is tough but it helps to develop interest of the students towards doing experiments themselves and understand the scientific concepts. The coaching sessions are conducted on Saturdays and Sundays. It is observed that the parents who come with their child also enjoy the sessions. This year out of the four students of 6th Std., who appeared for the written examination, two of them are selected for the project and interview level. It is possible that one of these two may get at least a bronze medal in this category.



TOWARDS EXPANSION....

The Founder President and Chairman had a dream to start a nursing school and some other vocational training courses for women empowerment, on a large scale. The Founder President donated one acre of land in Charholi Bk., to bring their dream into a reality. Keeping the need of land to start a Nursing School, and other vocational courses, the trust recently purchased a piece of land adjoined to its one acre plot. The architects of the trust have prepared the building plan, which would be finalized shortly. The total project cost of this proposed multifaceted training centre is estimated to Rs.s 6.00 crores. In the first phase, the trust wishes to construct Ground + 2 floors, where the courses shall be run, step by step. Taking into consideration the need and further expansion plans, the remaining part of the bldg. plan would be completed in Phase II

PROPOSED COURSES (IST PHASE) (A) Nursing

Future Need of Nurses -

The 2012 report of World Health Organization states that India needed 2.4 million nurses in order to achieve the nurse patient ratio of one nurse per 500 population by 2012. The current nurse patient ratio is one nurse per 2250 patients.

Despite training 60,000 nurses annually and a faculty student ratio of 1:45, India faces shortage of nurses at every level of the health care system. Over 20 per cent of the qualified nurses go abroad for improved pay and professional development creating a vacuum in healthcare human resources. This is directly manifested in the high infant and child mortality rates in states with the worst nurse shortage. In India there are 2,000 nursing diploma schools, 1,200 nursing degree schools and 281 M.Sc. nursing colleges. However, there is disparity in the distribution of nursing educational institutions across the country, with the four southern states having two-thirds of the nursing institutes in the country.

Taking into consideration the increasing need of Nurses and the disparity in nursing educational institutes in the country, there is tremendous scope for running a Nursing School at Charholi Budruk, Tal. Haveli, Dist.Pune. Since 1989 the trust is running Asst. Nursing Course and has been able to train more than 1400 students from underpreviliged strata of the society. In this proposed expansion we will be able to cover more number of students through diploma and degree courses in nursing, step by step.

(B) YOGA Training Cenre

It is a fact that today's life has become stressful. Right from the kids up to senior citizens, there is a stress. In order to control the stress and avoid the physical as well as psychological problems, arising out of stresses, Yoga Therapy is accepted worldwide. It is a gift given by India to the world. Unfortunately, there is a great need to train people to follow yoga in our own

country.

The art of practicing yoga helps in controlling an individual mind, body and soul. It brings together physical and mental disciplines to achieve a peaceful body and mind, it helps to manage stress and anxiety and keep you relaxing. It also helps in increasing flexibility, muscle strength and body tone. It improves respiration, energy and vitality.

Man is a physical, mental and spiritual being; yoga helps promote a balanced development of all the three. The follower of Yoga feels rejuvenated and energized. Thus, Yoga bestows upon every aspirant the powers to control body and mind. Yogic exercises recharge the body with cosmic energy This facilitates

- Attainment of perfect equilibrium and harmony
- Promotes self- healing.
- Removes negative blocks from the mind and toxins from the body
- Enhances Personal power
- Increases self-awareness
- Helps in attention focus and concentration, especially important for children
- Reduces stress and tension in the physical body by activating the parasympathetic nervous system

With the help of reputed institutes in the field of Yoga, we proposed to run Yoga courses which in turn helps the society to be stress free & physically fit.

[C] Vocational Training Courses

In spite of the various measures taken up by the government after Independence, women haven't been fully empowered. We still witness dowry deaths, domestic violence and exploitation of women. The female foeticide is not an uncommon phenomenon. The male female ratio though improved over last few years is still far from satisfactory. It is 940 women per 1000 men for India. In some states it is as much lower as 877. The female literacy rate is also lower than the male literacy rate. One can easily come across with incidents of deprivation, degradation and exploitation of women, specially from rural areas and from deprived sectors of the society. Everybody of us is eager to see our Nation into the rank of developed Nations. To bring this dream into a reality, the society will have to strive hard for the empowerment of women. Hence the role of NGOs like 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee, in this regard has become important. Since 1990 Wardhinee is running vocational training courses and the results are quite encouraging. In this proposed Multifaceted Training Centre, Wardhinee plans to start few short duration courses, as listed below.


